#### **MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT**


President Sends:

On 12 October, CPT(R) Richard Harvey and SFC(R) Robert Carey received one and two Purple Heart's for wounds received in Vietnam and Afghanistan respectively. The standing room only event, was followed by a catered lunch. During the ceremony, both individuals

were also recognized and presented with handmade quilts by Barb and Jack Steers from Quilts of Valor and received a Purple Heart coin from local Purple Heart Chapter 1836 Commander Tony Roman.



The SFA cruise was attended by over a dozen Chapter members. Along with ports of call in Freeport and Nassau, SF group photos, and interesting guest speakers and presentations; the event was a resounding success. 



The VBSN track is open to veterans from all branches of the service and is designed to build on the education and experience of the veteran with a system of assessment that will allow for advanced placement in the curriculum based upon demonstration of knowledge and skill. This accelerated 12-month track has online classes in addition to clinical instruction guided by assigned clinical coaches and nursing clinical faculty. The track has clinical sites in Abilene, Amarillo, Austin, Dallas-Fort Worth, Lubbock, Odessa and San Antonio.
